### **President's Message**

Dear Colleagues,

It is a great honour for me to be the President of the International Association of Paediatric Dentistry, especially during this exciting period of the Association's increasing impact and recognition, growth in the number of its members and its new administration and profile. It is a period that, as the Immediate Past President Dr Tsai has stated several times, IAPD is evolving from a good to great association.

In our new Board, apart from the excellent colleagues, the Secretary General Dr. Ari Kupietzky, the Past President

Dr. Anthony Tsai, the Honorary Editor Prof Anne O'Connell and the Representatives of Nations Professors Bernadette Drummond and Taku Fujiwara, we had the pleasure and honour to welcome Professor Marcelo Bonecker in the position of President Elect and two new Representatives of the Nations, Professors Norbert Kramer and Christopher Hughes. I feel very

privileged to be working with all these distinguished scientists and by now great supporters and friends.

In the current Board, like our predecessors, we remain committed to the founding principles of IAPD, namely, the promotion of the oral health of children worldwide. IAPD is the global voice for children's oral health and our strategy is not only to continue growing but also to raise our voice to all international health authorities and request that they include and emphasize in their educational curricula, the importance of oral health for the wellbeing of children.

We have already made progress in this direction.

Soon after my inauguration, the Secretary General Dr. Ari Kupietzky and I travelled to Geneva to meet with the World Health Organization (WHO) Oral Health Program Officer, Dr. Benoit Varenne, and his assistant, Dr. Yuka Makino, and initiated a new collaboration plan with this important organization. We also met with the World Dental Federation(FDI) Executive Director Enzo Bondioni and reconfirmed our long time collaboration, with IAPD

participation in the annual FDI Congress and the World Oral Health Day (WOHD) program.

The IAPD new Board of Directors met in January 2018. During this meeting, a very important decision was made: In November 2018 we are launching the First IAPD Global Summit Meeting. The IAPD Board is organising, for the first time, a monothematic three and a half day meeting on Early Childhood Caries (ECC), a global epidemic disease that is one of the main oral health problems of childhood worldwide. The aim of this meeting is to reach a long overdue global consensus on the definition of ECC. For this purpose, we are inviting leading scientists on the topic, researchers and clinicians, from around the globe to discuss and agree on auniversally accepted definition.


Invitations will be extended to representatives of our 69 National Member Societies as well as representatives of WHO, FDI, American Academy of Pediatric Dentistry (AAPD), European Academy of Paediatric Dentistry (EAPD), Pediatric Dental Association of Asia (PDAA), Latin American Association of Pediatric Dentistry (ALOP), the Alliance for a Cavity Free Future to network and actively participate in interactive sessions with the expert group. This meeting, will also have a very interesting scientific program with an emphasis on clinical updates on the management of ECC as well as poster sessions. Several prominent scientists have already eagerly accepted our invitation and we hope to see you all there for this important scientific event!

The 26th IAPD Congress in Santiago, Chile was the most important scientific event of our Association during 2017. Our Chilean colleagues organized an excellent congress that attracted delegates from 69 countries and 1327 participants. A major session during the Congress was the Global Leaders Forum that our Immediate Past President, Dr Anthony Tsai, organized very successfully. During this



session, the Presidents of the major Regional Associations (AAPD, EAPD, PDAA, ALOP) had a unique chance to meet and discuss together the education issues on Paediatric Dentistry worldwide, proving again that IAPD provides a unique platform for the global interaction of paediatric dentistry scientists and leaders.

Last but not least, I am very happy to have participated in the IAPD Regional Meeting that was held in Johannesburg this past March. The Organizing Committee, headed by Dr. Marietjie Weakley, planned an excellent scientific event that attracted delegates from 22 countries paving the way for more IAPD scientific events and activities on the African continent. ## **Honorary Editor's Report**

The International Journal of Paediatric Dentistry continues to grow and remains the journal with the greatest impact factor within Pediatric Dentistry. IAPD wish to acknowledge the fantastic work of Professor Christopher Deery during his tenure resulting in the

increase in Impact Factor (currently 1.532) and ranking of IJPD (currently 41st of 90 Dental Journals and 69th of 121 within Paediatric Journals). In 2017, there were 6 issues with 60 articles published and 2 special supplements publishing abstracts from the 26th Congress of the International Association of Paediatric Dentistry, Chile and the

British Society of Paediatric Dentistry Annual Scientific Meeting, Manchester, UK. Accepted manuscripts reflect the international status of the journal with a huge range of nationalities being represented with Brazil and UK being the highest contributor nations.

The most significant development in 2017 was the search for the new Editor-in-chief (2018-2022) and the Search Committee included representatives from IAPD, BSPD and Wiley. Applications were received from diverse geographical locations, reflecting the status of IJPD across the world. Dr Daniela Raggio was successful and began her appointment as Editor-in-Chief of IJPD in January 2018. Dr Raggio is an Associate Professor in the Pediatric Dentistry Department of the School of Dentistry in the University of São Paulo, São Paulo, Brazil. Her main research areas are Cariology, Clinical Trials, Systematic Reviews, Dental Materials and also Oral Health Related Quality of Life.

The handover process started after the IAPD Congress in Chile with new submissions only, assisted by Professor Deery, Anne O'Connell, Sondos Albadri and Mie Bak. Dr Raggio reports that up to February 20th, 2018, the total number of papers received is 92 (3 Brief Clinical Reports,

14 Case Reports, 68 original articles and 7 reviews). The acceptance rate is 4.8% There is no data available regarding the turnover process because of the short period to grant this information. Many of the features of IJPD work exceptionally well and will be retained. In addition to adding new members to the Editorial Board, Dr Raggio has plans to propose changes to submission guidelines. She says 'one idea is that IJPD could publish

research protocols, from ongoing trials, without results.

Also, we could ask for authors to identify guidelines other than CONSORT eg. PRISMA for systematic reviews,

The efficiency of the review process relies on dedicated reviewers with expert scientific background and knowledge who respond in a timely manner. IAPD wishes to thank the Editorial Board and all reviewers for their commitment so far and recognize their contribution to the status of IJPD.

STROBE for observational studies, STARD for diagnostic

studies, SPIRIT for protocols, among others'.

Dr Raggio plans new initiatives to address delays in the review process by identifying individuals who are willing to accept assignments and respond within review deadlines. The Board of IAPD plan to work with the new Editor-in-chief and the Editorial Board to continue the successful production of IJPD. Please help continue this success, contact us with any ideas and please consider becoming a reviewer for IJPD and recruiting your colleagues to participate with the review process.

## 1st IAPD Global Summit Meeting

### IAPD Welcomes you to the 1st IAPD Global Summit on ECC

Dear Colleagues,

This year the IAPD Board is organizing our first Global Summit. Global summits will have a particular scope: to come to internationally accepted consensus on various issues within the specialty of Paediatric Dentistry. We believe that this will help research and education since it will bridge any discrepancies in terminology, assessment criteria and treatment of various dental problems of childhood that exist worldwide.

The topic of our first Global Summit is Early Childhood Caries, and we are bringing together leading scientists from around the globe as well as representatives of the Regional Paediatric Dentistry Associations, the World Health Organization(WHO), the International Dental Federation(FDI), the Alliance for a Cavity Free

Future (ACFF) and of course leaders of our 69 National Societies, to discuss and agree on a long overdue, internationally accepted definition for ECC. This will facilitate research and clinical management of one of the most prevalent diseases to affect children and one of the leading public health issues in many countries.

During the scientific program there will be interactive sessions with the invited scientists to facilitate discussion and exchange of information on the topic.

Parallel to th activity, there will be a special meeting of all representatives in order to network and discuss any issues they face in their country.

We invite all of you to participate in this important scientific event, as you will have the opportunity not only to discuss and exchange information on one of the major challenges of our specialty, learn about the latest innovations on the management of this disease and have a unique opportunity to network with our colleagues from around the globe.

The meeting will be held in 1-4 November 2018 in Bangkok, Thailand.



### The Planning of the 1st IAPD Global Summit on ECC

The format of the meeting will be a three-and-a-half-day conference.

On the afternoon of the first day a Pre-Meeting with IAPD Board and National Societies Presidents will take place. Following the meeting, the Opening Ceremony will take place with representatives of American Academy of Pediatric Dentistry (AAPD), Latin American Association of Pediatric Dentistry (ALOP), European Academy of Paediatric Dentistry (EAPD), the Pediatric Dental Association of Asia (PDAA), WHO (World Health Organization), Alliance for Cavity Free Future (ACFF) and FDI (World Dental Federation).

The scientific program will commence on the second day, with presentations from the seven members of the group of experts, followed by an interactive session with the representatives and delegates in which there will be questions from the floor. The members of the group of experts and the subject that they will present are:

Prof. Norman Tinanoff (USA): Identification and Occurrence of ECC;

Dr Coleman Mc Grath (China): Impact of ECC on Oral Health Related Quality of Life;

Lecturers that are confirmed to cover the scientific program for the delegates are: Norbert Krämer (Germany), Monty Duggal (Singapore), Christopher Hughes (USA), Anne O'Connell (Ireland), Taku Fujiwara (Japan), Ted Croll (USA) and Francisco Ramos-Gomez (USA).

On the morning of the fourth day the outcome of the discussion on the terminology and definition of ECC will be presented and discussed with the entire Summit participants.





# Great Success of the 26th IAPD Congress in Santiago, Chile

The 26th IAPD Congress was hosted by the Chilean Society of Paediatric Dentistry (SCHOP). The theme of the Congress was "A Southern View for Children's Smiles". The preparation of the Congress took six years with the collaboration of SCHOP and the Board of Directors of IAPD.

The 26th IAPD Congress Chile was the first IAPD Congress in South America in twenty years since the last Congress in Argentina in 1997.

The Santiago Congress attracted 1327 attendees from 60 countries.

Built in the 1880s, Santa Carolina vineyard was selected by the Congress Committee, as the ideal place for the Gala Dinner.







































### IAPD Global Leaders Forum during the Chile Congress

It is the first time in IAPD Congress that leaders from other regional Pediatric Dentistry organizations are invited to attend the "IAPD Global Leaders Forum". The Forum is the extension of mutual collaboration between IAPD and other organizations such as EAPD, PDAA, ALOP, AAPD. The collaboration goes beyond providing complimentary registration and booth in IAPD Congress. The establishment of the Forum in the Scientific program offers a great opportunity for other organizations to expand their exposure to a wider audience. Reciprocally, IAPD enjoys advocate and promotion of our organization and Congress in their scientific meetings/conferences. The influences of all parties are amplified by extending their interaction through eachother's network.

The IAPD Global Leaders Forum session at the IAPD Congress provides a unique opportunity for international leaders of Pediatric Dentistry to present their views, share and exchange information with other leaders from around the globe. A Q&A session was held following the presentations. The audiences and the panellists exchanged views in various topics. The establishment of speciality and the use of the physical restraint attracted much discussion. The session stimulated many ideas for collaboration such as a general survey of speciality status and issues of immigrants with culture impacts on practice of pediatric dentistry. The IAPD Global Leaders Forum set a new stage for future collaborations between IAPD and other organizations. It is obvious that information exchanges among different parts of the world should be done on a regular basis. IAPD serves as the big family of Pediatric Dentistry will continue to take on the responsibility of promoting cooperation and friendship.







### IAPD Regional Meeting South Africa: "A New Smile for Africa"

The African Regional Meeting was hosted by the Paedodontic Society of South Africa under the presidency of Dr. Marietjie Weakley in March, 2018.

The 5 main streams covered were, Behaviour Management, Dental Biomaterials, Pain and Fear, Sedative Methods, Aesthetics and the meeting finished with an Expert Session followed by questions from the participants.

This Meeting brought together 130 dentists from 22 countries. Five keynote speakers were invited to speak at this two-day meeting, Dr. Anna Maria Vierrou (Greece), IAPD President, Dr. Ari Kupietzky (Israel), IAPD Secretariat, Prof. Norbert Kraemer (Germany), IAPD Board Member and President of the German Society, Dr. Morenke Ukpong (Nigeria), Past IAPD Board Member and Prof. Eduardo Alcaino (Australia), a Past IAPD President.

A platform was provided for the 3 best abstracts to provide a 5 minute rapid oral presentation.

Very importantly, this Regional Meeting brought

together representatives of the four Dental Schools of South Africa, who for the first time met together for the purpose to lay the foundations for a common education curriculum and eventually for the recognition of our specialty in their country.


# New Award for IAPD Members: The JSPD Travel Award for Young Researchers from Developing Countries

#### 2. Pediatric Dentistry Saturday Refreshment

The Pediatric Dentistry Saturday Refreshment took place on June 3rd, 2017, organized by the Argentine Association of Child Odontology in collaboration of the Postgraduate School of the Argentine Odontological Association, and was coordinated by Dr. Laura Cretacotta. 83 colleagues attended the course in total. The course began with a dissertation of Dr. Alicia Brea on the subject "How can we solve pain and infection during pediatric dental emergencies?" This was followed by a lecture by Dr. Ana Colloca on the subject "What can pediatric dentists do about medical emergencies in our office?" After the lecture there was a time for discussion and questions, concluding with a prize raffle of products donated by companies SUNSTAR, DINA Dental and NICOFER (from La Plata).

#### 3. AAON BULLETIN

The association continues publishing the latest scientific news of its discipline via the official AAON BULLETIN. Two issues were published in this period: Volume 45, issues 1 and 2.

#### 4. XV Students Conference 2017

The AAON carried out the XV Students Conference 2017 on Saturday, September 16th, 2017. # Canadian Academy of Pediatric Dentistry





We began 2018 with an assembly called "who's afraid from the Y generation" that dealt with the changing nature of the children and adolescents, the changing parenthood and our tools as pediatric dentists to deal with the "new" kids and parents that come into our clinics.

We had an inspiring lecture by Dr. Ari Kupietzky, Secretary General of the International Association of Paediatric Dentistry - "Teachers or technicians: the challenges of pediatric dental behavior management in a changing world" – Dr. Kupietzky gave a comprehensive lecture about the changing character of pediatric patients over the last years and the possible sources for the increasing problems of behavior management. Dr. Kupietzky spoke about the transformation in the structure of families, the variety of education methods that exist nowadays and the variety of behaviors of children as a result of our new reality.

Two children psychologists have dealt with that issue. Mr. Dor Harrari, an educational psychologist, talked about the problems created within the family when the increasing chores, children's education and the burden of everyday's life don't always meet together. Often parents try to compensate their children over lost time on the expense of education and of setting limits. Mr. Naftaly Edry, a medical psychologist, talked about the tools to deal with the "modern" child and how to leverage the modernization and the easily distracted child to our behalf.

A medical clown – Mr. Sarhan Mahamid – has put a smile on our faces and explained the importance of laughter to the mental and physical health of the child. Laughter can be used as a tool in breaking the ice with the child patient, taking down barriers and opening a communication channel with the patient.

We also gave an emphasis to an ethical issue –Mrs. Carmit Elad from Tzimaon, a voluntary association has exposed us to the life of children of asylum seekers from Sudan and Eritrea that live in southern Tel Aviv in awful conditions. She gave us a brief background about

Tzimaon, that operates about 100 volunteers who come every week to give the children hugs and love, to play with them, sing to them, talk and listen. They aim to provide these children with light and happiness. Tzimaon also operates a voluntary project providing dental screening checkups in the kindergartens and free dental treatments by pediatric and general dentists in their own clinics.

The conference was both enlightening and enjoyable We are looking forward to our next gathering.

# Kenya Association of Paediatric Dentists

The Kenya Association of Paediatric Dentists had a fruitful year. Among the highlights was the annual training of 30 Community Oral Health officers; a cadre whose primary responsibility lies in providing preventive oral health services. They were trained on provision of preventive oral health care services to children with special health care needs. The programme culminated in a free oral health examination of children with hearing disability from an integrated school. Joining them were Paediatric dentists from Kenya, Uganda and Ethiopia, who had come to attend a meeting of the Paediatric Dentists Association of East Africa (PDAEA) in Nairobi. The participants appreciated their role in identification of the need for oral health workers in Kenya to work as teams for the betterment of the oral health service for this special group of children. The aforementioned workshop was undertaken with the support of Global Child Dental Fund under the leadership of Raman Bedi.

KAPD organized a workshop for paediatric dentists from East Africa. The discussions emanating from this forum led to the identification of Infant Oral Mutilation as a major concern in the region. A taskforce was established with a mandate to further interrogate this issue and come up with strategies on prevention of mutilation in children who are affected by these traditional practices.

Other activities included continuing professional development (CPD) forums. Some of the topics covered included General Anaesthesia for Paediatric Dental patients, restorative dentistry solutions in children and adolescents (in partnership with 3M) and European Paediatric Life Support training.



# Philippine Pediatric Dental Society

PPDSI is shining brightly as it marks 25 years in service, training, and research. With 9 out of 10 Filipino children with dental caries, PPDSI has been busy trying to improve this statistic; A very tall order indeed. This poor oral health among children is primarily brought about by a slew of factors - low dental awareness, ignorance of the importance of primary teeth by healthcare providers, poverty, bad lifestyle choices and lack of dental providers in the rural areas, to name a few.

For the past 25 years, PPDSI has been working hard to improve this sad state of oral health of Filipino children. We collaborate with different government sectors and private organizations to put up specific programs for our target populations, e.g. for the 6 months - 3 years old, for the daycare children, for the school-aged, for those with special needs, for the pregnant mothers, for the new mothers, and other. We also have affiliated ourselves with the Philippine Pediatric Society, the national group of pediatricians in the country, to help us disseminate that good oral health is part of total overall health. For the professional, we constantly hold continuing education seminars on different topics of pediatric dentistry; we hold workshops on preventive strategies for children to empower the general practitioners especially those in the provinces to train them to manage very young children; we have a training program in Advanced Education in Pediatric Dentistry to produce specialists; we invite world-class speakers to speak at our conferences to update our members and colleagues with the latest trends in our field.

And to mark our 25th year this 2018, we still plan to do what we do best - as we have several plans to

mark this milestone with a year-long celebration. We started with a 2-day seminar attended by 200 delegates composed of our members and colleagues who share our passion in treating children. With the theme, Keeping Up with the Evidence, it aimed to update our audience with the latest guidelines and clinical evidence in pediatric dentistry to help guide them in decision making. We also celebrated our National Dental Health Month last February with a whole month of activities. It launched with a dental fair - a puppet show for the children, game booths, a mothers' class for the pregnant women and a mothers' class on the care and importance of baby teeth. For the whole month of February, PPDSI volunteers were deployed in the different regions of the country to lecture to mothers - on how to care properly for their children's teeth and for those with special needs.

And for the coming months, we plan to hold another continuing education seminar that will go around the provinces, as we partner with a local pharmaceutical company, Unilab, Inc., with their pain reliever medication for children. With a theme of the child's oral health related quality of life, the lectures will focus on pain management with a workshop on prescription writing for children. We also plan to launch a new community program - targeting prevention and caries control on daycare children, making a dental home for every Filipino child in the every barangay.

All of these put PPDSI in the forefront of Philippine dentistry, the leader in the oral healthcare of Filipino children. And we still plan to do more and be around in the future to continue to serve the our beloved children as we do our little part in nation building.

## 29th Annual Meeting of the Spanish Society of Odontopaediatrics

The scientific programme began on Thursday, 11 May, with the Interceptive Orthodontics Course "New interceptive treatment protocols in class II, III and open bites", given by Professor Enrique Solano Reina and Beatriz Solano Mendoza. This was followed by an enjoyable congress dinner, at which prizes were given to the best communications and posters.

During the last day, Saturday, 13 May, there was a course for dental hygienists and a workshop where we learned to place the new zirconium crowns on primary teeth. We also had the great pleasure of listening to Dr Claudio Pisacane, who showed us his wealth of case studies in traumatised young permanent teeth, with particular emphasis on their prognosis and long-term evolution. No less interesting was the lecture given by Dr Jordi Pérez Manauta on a subject of enormous current interest, namely, the stratified restoration of anterior teeth.









### **18th Paediatrics-Paediatric Dentistry Meeting**

Madrid, 16 December 2017

Once again, the Gregorio Marañón University Hospital hosted the Paediatrics-Paediatric Dentistry Meeting, whose 18th edition was held on 16 December. This event brings together two important Spanish scientific societies, the Spanish Association of Paediatrics (AEP) and the Spanish Association of Paediatric Dentistry (SEOP), with the goal of sharing knowledge about the health of children and adolescents.

Dr Paloma Planells del Pozo (SEOP) and Dr Jesús García Pérez (AEP) have been the directors of this 18th edition of the meeting, with Dr José Ignacio Salmerón Escobar as scientific director. The event was coordinated by Dr Eva Martínez Pérez and Dr Mónica Miegimolle Herrero, thanks to whose hard work about 300 attendees were able to enjoy this meeting.

Dr Manuel Tousidonis Rial had the task of opening the meeting with his talk "Craniomaxillofacial reconstruction

in paediatric patients", in which he shared some impactful case reports. In many of these cases, the reconstruction surgery was performed using a surgical splint obtained by digital planning of the operation. Therefore, one of this lecture"s main conclusions was the digitization of maxillofacial surgery. As with digital dentistry, this new concept is allowing more precise and individualized planning for each case.

This was followed by Dr Mónica Miegimolle Herrero, with her lecture entitled "Children"s dental care programme in the Community of Madrid". In this lecture, she summarised the main points of this recently deployed programme, as well as reporting on the oral and dental care offered by the public health services in the Community of Madrid, both now and in the past.

This address sparked some debate about the subject, particularly by those paediatric dentists who already take part in this programme, both in the Madrid Health Service and in the private dental clinics that are included in this agreement, who contributed their viewpoints and suggestions.

After the break, it was the turn of Dr Minia Campos

Rodríguez, whose lecture, entitled "Paediatric dermatology and paediatric dentistry: What do we have in common?", reviewed the main dermatological diseases of the oral and perioral area of the paediatric patient. This talk"s main message was that paediatric dentistry and paediatric dermatology have a lot more in common than may seem at first sight, since the paediatric dentist may be the first to notice certain conditions that appear in our area of care and require urgent referral to the dermatologist.

The fourth and last lecture was given by Dr Alberto Adanero Velasco and was entitled "Management of patients with autism spectrum disorder: Use of new technologies". In this lecture, he explained how the new technologies, such as smartphones or tablets, can be used to guide the behaviour of our more special patients. Dr Adanero also shared the results obtained with use of these devices in handling the behaviour of autistic patients at the Complutense University of Madrid, specifically at the Clinic awarding the qualification of Specialist in Integrated Dental Care in Children with Special Needs, run by Dr Paloma Planells, in which a higher number of dental interventions were achieved in these patients when tablets were used for behaviour management support.

Finally, the meeting closed with a few minutes of discussion in which the attendees were able to share their impressions of the event and propose new subjects for future editions.

Once again, the Paediatrics-Paediatric Dentistry Meeting has provided a forum in which practitioners specialised in child and adolescent health have been able to share their ideas and experiences, creating favourable conditions for improved cooperation in the future between professionals.

I would like to thank the organisers and coordinators of the meeting, and also the speakers who have taken part in this edition. Thanks to them, this event has maintained the high educational quality of previous meeting, with positive consequences for our patients" health.

# Swedish Society of Paediatric Dentisty

the new regulations for postgraduate education as together with The National Board of Health and Welfare which is a government agency in Sweden under the Ministry of Health and Social Affairs. We hope that the new regulations will increase the quality of the postgraduate education and ensure that all postgraduate students will receive a high quality education all over Sweden.

In December of 2017 the Board started a new project together with The National Board of Health and Welfare regarding national guidelines in Paediatric Dentistry, a work that will continue during 2018 as well as 2019. We hope that the new national guidelines will, in the future, improve the oral health of children in low socio-economic areas and equalize inequalities in children's oral health.



#### **Pediatric Dentist Workforce Study**

The AAPD contracted with the Center for Health Workforce Studies to produce a comprehensive pediatric dentist workforce study to provide the profession and policymakers an overall target for the ideal number of pediatric dentists in the U.S. A report on the findings is slated for fall 2018.

#### **Predictive Model for Caries Risk**

A new AAPD study produced a predictive model suggesting the odds of a child having tooth decay at the first dental visit more than doubles for every year of increased age. The study also offers clues to assist health care professionals identify caries risk in children during the well-child visit without taking time from other important health concerns.

#### **New Evidence-Based Guidelines**

Two evidence-based dentistry guidelines have been accepted by the National Guideline Clearinghouse and can be found in the AAPD 2017-2018 Reference Manual (http://www.aapd.org/policies/):

- Use of Vital Pulp Therapies in Primary Teeth with Deep Caries.
- Use of Silver Diamine Fluoride for Dental Caries Management.

Two additional evidence-based guidelines on nonvital pulp therapy and behavior guidance for the pediatric dental patient will be published later this year.
