Our committees are working hard to accomplish the various plans they have. At the beginning of the term, we launched a campaign to ask for volunteers to be part of IAPD committees and it was amazing the number of members who signed up for this task. Many of them were chosen to be part of IAPD committees.

The Association is growing with 78 nation members and more than 20,000 dentists involved with IAPD. We aim to increase the number of national society members by the end of this term. This year we should resume with our face-to-face activities, like the Regional Meetings and Teach the Teachers programs. The IAPD is now very active in social media. Platforms like Facebook have a high number of members. Social media is a great way to be in direct contact among us. The PR committee is working to continue our presence in other social media. The Young IAPD Network is also working in the



recruitment of young pediatric dentists, the future of IAPD.

Associations and governments from all over the world have worked on protocols and recommendations for the management of the pediatric dental patient, and usually adapted to their regions. Our science committee led by Dr. Norman Tinanoff, has worked very hard in the development of consensus recommendations. These recommendations have been reviewed not only by members of the Science committee, but also by a group of experts, researchers, and clinicians from all over the world. This document is very valuable for pediatric dentists globally. The consensus recommendations have been published on our web page and will be reviewed periodically.

After more than 2 years of no activities face to face, the Executive Committee decided to meet in Rome for a 3-day full meeting to discuss the present and the future of IAPD. This was a very fruitful meeting that will serve us a pathway for the future of our organization. An important activity during this trip to Rome was the visit to Pope Francis in the Vatican. We were able to talk to

Leveraging Our Knowledge and Partnerships to Improve the Oral Health of Children Worldwide

The past year was a remarkable and challenging time for IAPD, our component National Societies, individual members, and the children and families we are privileged to serve. COVID-19 again commanded the attention of nations, policy makers, communities and health care providers throughout the world. Despite

these challenges, the past year also witnessed several landmark activities which have set the stage for a new era for children's oral health.

In May 2021, the World Health Organization (WHO) approved a Resolution on Oral Health at the 74th World Health Assembly (WHA). The WHA, the decision-making body of WHO, is attended annually by

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delegations from all WHO Member States and focuses on a specific health agenda prepared by its Executive Board. The WHA-74 Oral Health Resolution recommends a shift from the traditional curative approach towards a preventive approach that includes promotion of oral health within the family, schools and workplaces, and includes timely, comprehensive and inclusive care within the primary health-care system. The Resolution affirms that oral health should be firmly embedded within the non-communicable disease agenda and that oral healthcare interventions should be included in universal health coverage programs.

Section 11 of the adopted resolution EB148.R1 notes that, "The use of fluorides for prevention of dental caries is limited, and essential prevention methods – such as community-based methods, topical fluoride applications or the use of fluoridated toothpaste – are often not available or affordable for many people. Moreover, oral health promotion is rarely integrated into other noncommunicable disease programmes that share major common risk factors and social determinants."Section 23 further acknowledges that, "Despite the efforts outlined (elsewhere in report), access to prevention, early diagnosis and treatment of oral diseases is far from universal and remains unattainable for millions of people. Member States" commitment to strengthening and accelerating action on oral health, in their statements during the 148th session of the Executive Board, offers a firm basis

for further action to boost national and international oral health policy agendas. Such action may include, but not be limited, reducing common risk factors and promoting healthy environments by promoting community-based interventions such as water fluoridation, where technically feasible and culturally acceptable, as well as legislation to increase the affordability and accessibility of effective fluoride toothpaste and advocating for its recognition as an essential health product.

The WHA delegates asked WHO to develop a draft global strategy on tackling oral diseases for consideration by WHO governing bodies in 2022; and by 2023, to translate the global strategy into an action plan for oral health.

Passage of the WHO Oral Health Resolution and the call for

continuing actions – especially during this time when global attention remains focused on combatting the COVID-19 pandemic – represents a remarkable acknowledgement of the impact that dental and oral diseases have on the world's population. They also represent a tremendous opportunity for IAPD and its component National Societies to leverage our knowledge, expand our partnerships and influence, and provide the expertise and leadership necessary to support international and national efforts to improve children's oral health as called for in the WHO

Oral Health Resolution.

It is with great sorrow that the International Association of Paediatric Dentistry (IAPD) announces that Professor Taku Fujiwara left us less than two months after fighting cancer. Prof Fujiwara (1959-2022) is recognized as the diplomat of Asian Peadiatric Dentistry. He was a treasured friend to many of us and a prominent figure (board member and committee member) at the IAPD.

Taku was on the IAPD Board of Directors for 4 years and worked hard to promote the friendship of IAPD members and to establish the IAPD website as the chairman of the IT Committee (today: Public Relations Committee). The JSPD Travel Award, an ongoing initiative, was led by him.

As an international director of JSPD, he set up the network of Paediatric dentists in Asia-pacific countries. he will be remembered as an eternal friend of pediatric dentists due to his active diplomatic activities in the field of pediatric dentistry in Asian countries as well as all over the world. He worked as a board member for PDAA (Pediatric Dental Association of Asia) for many years, trying to develop pediatric dentistry in Asian countries.

Taku left behind more than 200 papers and 16 books related to paediatric dentistry and cariology.

Everyone who remembers him will keep his gracious smile and warm heart in their minds, and many of the great things that he worked for the development of pediatric dentistry. His legacy will continue living through the work we do.

IAPD on behalf of all of its members across the globe extend its heartfelt condolences to his family and loved ones.





Project Title



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National Oral Health Education Program in Slovenia Award Year: 1997

How did your project contribute to the improvement of children's oral health?

Education of parents, teachers and children.

How many children were involved/reached? Most of the children in primary schools in Slovenia.

What changed during the years with your project while you were implementing it?

DMF in children aged 6 went from 1 in 1984 to 0.3 in 1992.

DMF in children aged 12 went from 7 in 1984 to 3.5 in 1992.

The trend continues, but the decline is not so steep.

What were the main achievements of the project? Dental education activities were incorporated in school programmes on a regular basis and are built up year after year.

What did it mean to you to win the BSBF Award? Higher motivation in children for seeing a dentist and structural changes of dental work in benefit in painless procedures.


Project Title

Healthy Children Bright Smiles
Award Year: 2003

How did your project contribute to the improvement of children's oral health?

By creating awareness of oral health amongst children, their parents as well as teachers.

How many children were involved/reached? 15000



Awareness of the importance of oral health increased.

What were the main achievements of the project? Dramatic change in their knowledge, attitude and practice habits. Reduction of prevalence of dental caries and a better gingival health status.


What did it mean to you to win the BSBF Award?

It was a great incentive to encourage students in improving their performance and understanding for caring for the oral health status of children.



Meet Manuel V. Vallesteros Philippines

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Mga Munting Ngiti (Sweet Little Smiles)

Award Year: 2005

How did your project contribute to the improvement of children's oral health?

It has become a best practice model (Basic Package of Oral Care) for the the geographically isolated and disadvantaged areas in the Philippines, both in government and NGO volunteer projects.

How many children were involved/reached? 50 Children, Grade 1 Learners

What changed during the years with your project while you were implementing it?

From grade 1 schoolchildren (6 year olds), the project was pushed to be implemented to the child's preschool years (3 to 5 years old) in daycare centres because earlier intervention will result in better outcomes before the permanent 6's come out. Moreover, good oral hygiene habits, integrated with handwashing, proved to be more sustainable and attractive to local government support. The addition of another technology, silver diamine fluoride (SDF), is more feasible and cost effective in the control of caries during the child's early years.

What were the main achievements of the project? The project became our central point of advocacy

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for Philippine Dentistry for the GIDA areas or in areas with limited resources. It has spawned more projects in other local areas, and has definitely increased awareness on early disease prevention and control.

What did it mean to you to win the BSBF Award? The BSBF Award gave me MORE opportunities (and the credibility) to push the program concept to other government and non-government organisations in improving children's oral health, aligned with the principles of equity and upcoming Universal Health Care. Currently, I have become the Chief of the Oral Health Division of the Department of Health of the Philippines, and I owe all my learnings from all the projects we have initiated since the BSBF Award. I got my inspiration to serve better and serve more after the BSBF Award.





Meet Karin Ziskind Israel



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Project Title



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Baby Clinic - A pre- and postnatal project to promote oral health **Award Year:** 2009

How did your project contribute to the improvement of children's oral health?

We showed that the BABY CLINIC approach is effective in preventing and controlling the severity of S- ECC.

How many children were involved/reached? 137

What changed during the years with your project while you were implementing it?

The paediatric dentists involved in the program continue to practice it in their private offices. It has been taught to the students since then.

What were the main achievements of the project? With this program we not only decreased the incidence of caries, but also detected the lesions at a very early stage of development, minimizing the need for operatory treatment.

What did it mean to you to win the BSBF Award? It was a reassurance that preventive information, especially for babies, is spread to other countries and thus to the largest possible number of parents and may help small children not to undergo painful treatment.







Meet Matina Angelopoulou Greece



Project Title



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School-based oral health education using experiential learning or lecturing Award Year: 2011

How did your project contribute to the improvement of children's oral health?

Changing behaviours is always challenging especially when it comes to preadolescent children and teenagers. Experiential learning was an innovative method that helped children discover the evidence themselves and change their behaviour accordingly. In our case, the experiential learning education was incorporated in the national curriculum and was successful in improving oral health. If oral health education could become part of the knowledge taught at school using innovative methods like experiential learning, children's oral health could be improved significantly.

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How many children were involved/reached? 351

What changed during the years with your project while you were implementing it?

The project lasted for 3 years and many different people were involved during that time. Also, with time, the methods of experiential learning implementation became more clear.

What were the main achievements of the project? Oral health education material, with experiential learning methods, was developed for 3 different levels of education (preschool, primary, middle school). This material is available for use even to this day and teachers can incorporate it in their

What did it mean to you to win the BSBF Award?

lessons.

It was a great recognition of my hard work and made me realise that this project was something more than just a thesis project. It changed children's oral health and its importance was internationally appreciated.







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Project Title

Brighter Smiles for the New Generation (BSNG)

International Association of Paediatric Dentistry

Award Year: 2013

How did your project contribute to the improvement of children's oral health?

Oral health is a major public health issue affecting all population groups. Poor oral health during childhood is directly associated with poor oral health outcomes in adulthood as people remain more susceptible to developing dental caries throughout their lives. Although kindergarten children may gradually develop the more desirable tooth brushing habit, our results showed that the proportion of children with the habit of tooth brushing twice daily with toothpaste increased significantly after the implementation of the BSNG programme. Preschool years are a critical period in the development of a healthy child. Early introduction of oral health promotion programmes could increase the oral health awareness of the children and help them to establish the desirable oral health habits at an earlier age. This promotes them to have a better oral health awareness in the later stage of their life.

How many children were involved/reached? 100,000 kindergarten children each year

What changed during the years with your project while you were implementing it?

To sustain the effect of the BSNG program in improving the oral health habit of the kindergarten children, some booster strategies throughout the kindergarten years especially during the summer holidays were implemented since 2019, such that the children and their parents were kept on reminding the importance of desirable toothbrushing and snacking habits over the year. In addition, instead of distributing the educational cartoon DVD to parents, the cartoon animation was uploaded to the internet in 2020. Parents just need to scan the QR code on the programme handbook to gain access to the animation.

What were the main achievements of the project? "Brighter Smiles for the New Generation " was effective in promoting kindergarten children to adopt good dietary habits as well as helping them to establish the desirable oral health habits (tooth brushing twice daily with toothpaste and parental supplementary tooth brushing) at an earlier age.

What did it mean to you to win the BSBF Award? We express our warm gratitude to the IAPD for giving us the Colgate BSBF Award. It meant so much to us that our programme design and promotion strategies were well recognized by IAPD.

How did your project contribute to the improvement of children's oral health?

Early Childhood Caries prevention implementing Infant oral Health Care programs.

How many children were involved/reached? 4500+ Children under the age of 5 years old

What changed during the years with your project while you were implementing it? More awareness , prevention and advocacy of Early Childhood Caries.

What were the main achievements of the project? ECC Prevention from 78% to 23% before COVID.


What did it mean to you to win the BSBF Award? Great pride and honour to be associated with BSBF.

How did your project contribute to the improvement of children's oral health?

We taught oral hygiene techniques to children with visual disabilities and they improved their oral hygiene index as a result. Additionally, they learnt to distinguish between healthy and cariogenic food.

How many children were involved/reached? 14 Children

What changed during the years with your project while you were implementing it?

The children were able to recognize between healthy and cariogenic food by touching them. They also distinguished a healthy mouth from one with decay and gingivitis. They learned brushing techniques and improved their oral hygiene index. Furthermore, they developed trust in the paediatric dentist by sharing their experiences with us.

What were the main achievements of the project? Motivate children with visual disabilities to learn about oral health involving their parents and teachers. Also, it was a big challenge that they could recognize the biofilm to know if their teeth were clean or not, and they succeeded.

What did it mean to you to win the BSBF Award?

It was a great honour to receive this award and it allowed me to continue training to provide the best care to my patients.




Meet Andreas Agouropoulos Greece

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Project Title



Award Year: 2019

How did your project contribute to the improvement of children's oral health?

The application of the program in Greece has reached a great number of children families and preschool teachers and has significantly improved oral health attitudes in the target population. The data from the scientific component of the program have been used in proposals to develop preschool age oral health policies and change the curriculum of daily activities in preschools, adopting healthier practices.

How many children were involved/reached? 12 000 Children & 1000 Teachers

What changed during the years with your project while you were implementing it?

Feedback from the preschools was that children and families responded very positively, changed habits and then was maintained even after completion of the program.

What were the main achievements of the project? Motivate children with visual disabilities to learn about oral health involving their parents and

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teachers. Also, it was a big challenge that they could recognize the biofilm to know if their teeth were clean or not, and they succeeded.

What did it mean to you to win the BSBF Award? The award was the recognition of a long effort for the total program and gave the opportunity to present it outside of the country. It was also a recognition of the scientific work done at the Paediatric Dentistry Department, School of Dentistry, National and Kapodistrian University, Athens Greece.

Collective Actions Internship Program: Changing Dental Students' Perception of Public Oral Health Care

Award Year: 2021

How did your project contribute to the improvement of children's oral health?

The project contributed to children's oral health through health education and oral health promotion.

How many children were involved/reached? 2100 Children

What changed during the years with your project while you were implementing it?

The methodology used in the "Collective Actions Internship" improves more than preventive views, but also stimulates the proactivity of the students to elaborate effective actions that may be the difference for vulnerable preschoolers, schoolers, and adolescents. Activities of the IAPD

IAPD Received by Pope **Francis at The Vatican** during the Executive **Committee Meeting**

The IAPD had a strategic planning meeting in Herzliya, Israel February 9-10, 2020. Two years later, the Board of Directors (BOD) approved the organization of an executive committee in-person meeting to further discuss and plan IAPD strategy. When a papal invitation was extended by the Nunzio Apostolico in Peru to President Jorge Castillo for an audience with the Pope in February, Rome was chosen for the EC meeting to coincide with the visit to the Vatican.

The meeting was held at the Le Meridien Visconti Hotel in Rome during two full days. Topics of discussion included a review of 2020 Strategic Plan Meeting Workshop that took place in 2020, an overview of the



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work of the IAPD Standing Committees, discussions on the International Journal of Paediatric Dentistry and the IAPD Fellowship, among others.

Under the current Board of Directors IAPD's prestige is growing and the association is transforming from being a congress-focused organization to a member-focused association. IAPD's scientific stature is improving consensus papers, webinars, global summits and newly appointed EIC of IJPD have all contributed to IAPD's reputation. IAPD is grateful to have fantastic, hard-working leaders!

After the meeting, a delegation from the IAPD was received by Pope Francis at the Vatican on February 16th, 2022.

The general audience was held in the Vatican-Rome in the Paul VI classroom, where the father cordially greeted the pilgrims in English, Spanish, Italian, Arab, Portuguese, German in the framework of the Catechesis



on Saint Joseph, Patron of the Universal Church.

The IAPD delegation was composed of the Executive Committee: Jorge Luis Castillo - President (Peru), Ari Kupietzky - Secretary General (Israel); Marcelo Bönecker, past president (Brazil); Figen Seymen, president-elect (Turkey) and Anna María Vierrou, past president (Greece). The group was joined by the immediate past president of the Italian Society of Paediatric Dentistry (SIOI), Gianmaria Fabrizio Ferrazzano (Italy), among others.

At the end of the ceremony, the pope received the IAPD delegation and had a short conversation in which they explained to the Holy Father the objectives of the association which is to integrate all the countries and regions of the world, specially the less favoured, so pediatric dentists in these areas receive the most appropriate training and certifications to standardize their knowledge and to improve oral health of children worldwide.

e are very excited to announce that the IAPD has partnered with LOW Academy to provide a new IAPD Fellowship Examination in Paediatric Dentistry!

The IAPD Fellowship in Paediatric Dentistry will be open to IAPD members in good standing and will be designed to test knowledge, and as such forms part of the overall assessment of training.

Paediatric dentists can earn fellow status based on education, licensure, and successful completion of the qualifying examination.

Fellows may promote their status by using in direct association with their names, Fellow of the International Association of Paediatric Dentistry or the initials, FIAPD.

The online examination will be held on 25th April 2023 and be open for applications from 1st August 2022.

How to become a Fellow of IAPD

To achieve the IAPD Fellowship certificate in Paediatric Dentistry, the following requirements have to be met:

Graduation from a dental school recognized by the appropriate authorities of the country of the applicant.

Membership - Current professional members in good standing of IAPD

Possession of a valid, unrestricted state license to practice dentistry

Verification of attendance at local, regional or international meetings sponsored or co-sponsored by IAPD and/or its National-Member Society with a minimum of 16 hours of education in topics relevant

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to the practice of paediatric dentistry.

Actively practicing exclusively or with a significant emphasis in paediatric dentistry for at least 3 years.

Successful completion of the Fellowship examination covering comprehensive oral health care for infants, children, adolescents, and special needs.

Commitment to life-long continuing education

The Exam

- 1. 100 multiple-choice questions (MCQs)
- 2. Two-hour examination session (online)
- 3. Understanding of scientific and biological principles
- 4. The examination tests knowledge and applied knowledge
- 5. The examination is delivered only in English.
- 6. The examination will be based on (but not limited to) the IAPD Foundational Articles and Consensus Recommendations developed by the Science Committee

The Revised IAPD **Foundational Articles and Consensus Guidelines: Quality of Evidence and Global Agreement**

he next edition of the IAPD Consensus Guidelines will have two unique and important features associated with each recommendation. Quality of Evidence Indicators will give readers the type of evidence that the Science Committee used in making each recommendation. The recommendations resulting from consensus on interventions based on an expert opinion, that is, lacking high-quality supporting evidence will have the designation "Consensusbase Statement". Those recommendations based on consensus on interventions supported by higher quality evidence, such as clinical trials or metaanalyses, will have the designation "Consensus-based Recommendation". The highest quality of evidence, "Evidence-based Recommendation" will be used when the recommendation is based on published clinical practice guidelines which evaluated the benefit or harmful effect of an intervention after systematic

review of literature followed by consensus on the certainty of evidence, patient values/preferences, resource allocation, and acceptability/feasibility. Global Percent Agreement will be the percentage of a representative cohort of IAPD members from various national associations that agree with each recommendation based on a 9-point Likert Scale for its applicability to global clinical practices. Percent agreements 70% or higher of "moderately/mostly/ strongly agree" reflects good concordance between a recommendation and current global practices.

Examples of revised recommendations:

High viscosity glass ionomer cements may be used in atraumatic restorative treatment (ART) or interim therapeutic restorations (ITR), as an option for conventional treatment in primary teeth. ART/ITR may be used for controlling caries in children that are not cooperative for definitive treatment or treating multiple open carious lesions before rendering definitive restoration. - Consensus-based Statement; 100% agreement

Pulpectomy, apexification, or MTA apical barrier may be used for immature permanent teeth with a nonvital pulp. - Consensus-based Recommendation; 88% agreement.

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

How to create a **Paediatric Dentistry** Association/Society

Essential Characteristics of an Association

An association is formed of those individuals who are organised in order to fulfill some specific interests. So, an association is known as an organised group.

The organisation of an association rests upon a particular set of laws. These laws are necessary for regulating the conduct of members belonging to an association. The members of an association follow these rules and regulations.

The membership of an association is voluntary. It is not compulsory. People voluntarily join in an association for the achievement of their desired objectives. They can also withdraw their membership according to their own wishes.

Why a Paediatric Dentistry Association?

The common goal of pediatric dentists is to improve children's oral health. Creating an association of paediatric dentists will contribute to the improvement of the oral health of children in their respective countries in many ways: educating local dentists to treat children in a more efficient way, disseminating scientific knowledge, networking with other private and government institutions, joining forces with commercial enterprises.

With regards to the interaction with the international Paediatric Dentistry community, a national association provides a way to network with other colleagues of our specialty around the globe. Some of these relationships and connections last forever.

Finally, a strong national professional association will

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greatly contribute to the recognition of the specialty of paediatric dentistry in any country.

There are many associations of paediatric dentists in the World. Seventy eight associations are part of IAPD. Most of the associations started when a small group of enthusiastic leaders founded their organization. We have witnessed the growth of many of them throughout the years.

Steps to Start an Association:



Gather a group of dentists interested in treating children and organize a first meeting to exchange ideas about the new association.



Create an organizing committee of the society. It can be formed by a small group of individuals.



The organizing committee should prepare a plan to create the association, including a schedule and deadlines.



Review what are the rules in your country to create an association. A lawyer or accountant may be consulted.



Start with the name. Groups of paediatric dentists throughout the world have different names: Association, Society, Academy. The former two usually include both specialists and general dentists while the latter usually is usually limited to specialists only.



Work on the development of constitution and bylaws. Examples of constitution and bylaws can be provided to you by IAPD.



Start recruiting the first members of the association. Set the requirements to belong to the association.

Set elections for the first board.



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The first board of the association is elected. Organize a commencement ceremony for the new board. Invite important guests, (1) authorities of other associations (dental and non-dental), government officials, etc.

The new board starts the affiliation with the International Association of Paediatric Dentistry (IAPD).

Recruiting the First Members

The guideline below will help you to set the member requirements:

A. Credentials: Some associations, require that the members should be certified pediatric dentists, others accept general dentists with an interest in pediatric dentistry. Other societies have two types of membership: regular members (certified pediatric dentists), associate members (general dentists). Other type of membership may be postgraduate students and affiliate members.

B. Legal: candidate should have a license to practice dentistry in your country.

C. Prepare a form so the candidate can fill the basic information about him-herself:

- i. Name
- ii. Address, telephone, email

iii. Number of years practicing dentistry/paediatric dentistry

iv. Place of work (private practice, university, military, etc)

- v. Short biosketch (CV)
- vi. Why do you want to join the association?
- **D.** Set a membership fee (annual or biennial)

E. The form will be reviewed initially by an organizing committee that will accept/reject the candidates

Setting Board Elections

The information below may serve as a reference when setting board elections:

- **A.** Create an election committee

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Virtual Success Story: 28th Congress of IAPD, June 2021

International Association of Paediatric Dentistry

The 28th Congress of the IAPD from 10 to 13 June 2021, which took place online due to COVID-19. Our main goal with this virtual congress was to support once more the paediatric dentistry community. We offered a low, inclusive registration rate to promote equity and support all economies around the globe faced with a crisis due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The main theme of our congress was "Advancing Together While Staying Apart".





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

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Argentine **Association of Dentistry** for Children

he Argentine Association of Dentistry for Children (AAON), one of the branches of the Argentine Dental Association (AOA), held its monthly Council meetings virtually (Zoom platform). Meetings were chaired by Dr. Gabriel Sánchez, who assumed the presidency of the AAON in April. From April through September, an annual update course on pediatric dentistry - organized jointly with the Dental Board of General Roca - was held virtually. From 27-30 May 2021, the 30th Biannual Meeting of the AAON was held virtually for the first time, gathering 300 participants, 41 international and local lecturers, and 25 poster presenters. Awards sponsored by Colgate were presented to the two best presentations selected by an expert jury. Oral B, Savant Pharm, Sidus, Sunstar,

Ortotek, Bernabó and IBC also sponsored the event. On Saturday, 3 July, a one-session update course on pedodontics jointly organized with the AOA had 95 registered participants. The AAON was represented by its president at the Executive Meeting of the IAPD Council (June), the XIth Meeting of the Venezuelan Pediatric Dental Association (June), the IXth Bolivian International Congress of Pediatric Dentistry (July) and the Meeting of the Latin American Association of Pediatric Dentistry (ALOP). Four Zoom webinars were organized and held successfully. The program of training and update activities was available through the AAON website and social media sources – Facebook. Instagram and WhatsApp. The IAPD e-Newsletter was e-mailed to all AAON members. Three specialization courses to be held through the Postgraduate School of the AOA were planned for 2022. By the end of the reporting period, the number of members of the AAON was 346.



National Member Societies' Reports

Association of Paediatric and **Preventive Dentists of** Serbia

ssociation of Paediatric and Preventive Dentists of Serbia (APPDS) continued realization of the project "Oral Health Promotion Program for Children and Adolescents in the Republic of Serbia" funded by the Government of Serbia, Ministry of Health. After the epidemiological study was performed in 2019, and data analyzed in 2020, goals for 2021 were to propose measures for prevention of oral diseases in children and adolescents according to the population's needs.

The APPDS Spring Symposium "Improving the oral health of children and adolescents in the Republic of Serbia- a proposal of measures" was held on-line on April 9, 2021. Both international and national experts presented recommendations for prevention of oral diseases in children and adolescents: Professor Lorna Macpherson (University of Glasgow, Scotland), Professor Christian Splieth (University of Greifswald, Germany), Professor Natalia Gateva (Medical University Sophia, Bulgaria), Professor Dejan Markovic, Professor Zoran R Vulicevic, Professor Tamara Peric, Dr. Ana Vukovic (University of Belgrade, Serbia), Professor Bojan Petrovic (University of Novi Sad, Serbia), and Dr. Biljana Kilibarda (Institute for Public Health "Dr. Milan Jovanovic Batut", Serbia).

More than 200 participants attended the Symposium (180 dentists and 37 dental assistants). Forty-seven participants presented their works as e-posters. Abstract book is available online at:

III Congress of Preventive Dentistry was held as a hybrid conference in Belgrade on November 19-20,

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2021. A congress symposium "Recommendations for clinical practice in the prevention of oral health in children and adolescents in the Republic of Serbia - consensus conference" was organized on-line on November 19. The symposium comprised interactive participation of all attendants. Experts from various fields gave lectures: paediatric dentistry (Professor Dejan Markovic, Professor Tamara Peric, Dr. Ana Vukovic (University of Belgrade), Professor Bojan Petrovic (University of Novi Sad)), periodontology (Professor Natasa Nikolic Jakoba, University of Belgrade), orthodontics (Professor Evgenija Markovic, University of Belgrade), and public health (Dr. Biljana Kilibarda, Institute for Public Health). In order to obtain insight into the opinion of dental professionals, the participants filled out an on-line questionnaire during the lectures (available at: https://docs.google. com/forms/d/12MPdHeanCCMXZURVBPzaOoGDMr--wj7cGmvahmbgmBQ).

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In parallel with the lectures, participants were asked to express agreement with the proposed measures for prevention of oral and dental diseases in children and adolescents in Serbia. A total of 128 dentists took active part in the consensus conference, of which 38 specialists in preventive and paediatric dentistry and 29 doctors attending specialization course in preventive and paediatric dentistry.



The Australian and New Zealand Society of Paediatric Dentistry (ANZSPD) Biennial Congress scheduled to be held in March 2022 in Perth, Western Australia was postponed due to the prevailing conditions and restriction in Western Australia. We hope to run this meeting later in the year either in Perth or another city in Australia.

Our membership remained steady in 2021-2022 at approximately 350 active members in the Australian and New Zealand region. As for professional development activities during the past year, ANZSPD Federal and the various state and territories branches continued to organise webinars throughout the year which provided much needed CPD and credits for our

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Austrian **Association for Paediatric** Dentistry

he Austrian Society for Paediatric Dentistry (OeGKiZ), established in 2005, has a current membership of about 200 dentists. Since its foundation, the OeGKiZ has focused on paediatric dental education and promotion of children's oral health awareness in Austria. In October 2021, the OeGKiZ elected a new Board of Directors consisting of seven members: Bettina Bauer (President), Katrin Bekes (1st Vice-President), Irene Zifko (2nd Vice-President), Petra Drabo (3rd Vice-President), Marie-Therese Brenner (Secretary), Andrea Gamper (Treasurer) and Nicola Meißner (Continuing Education).

Once a year, the OeGKiZ organizes a curriculum for dentists, a training program on nitrous oxide sedation according to the guidelines of the Council of European Dentists (CED) resolution, and education for dental assistants in a team approach. Every two years, a biannual conference is held in Salzburg in spring. The last congress was set to take place in April 2020, but had to be cancelled due to COVID and the lockdown in Austria. The OeGKiZ is looking forward to its next conference in March 2022, hopefully in-person in Salzburg. British Society of Paediatric Dentistry

SPD held its first virtual Annual Scientific Conference in October 2021 with the theme "20/20 Vision", focusing on the role of dentists in advocating for patients. There were scientific sessions on Sugar, Obesity and Food Marketing, Adverse Childhood Experiences, Sights and Sounds of Childhood, and Current Concepts and Innovations in Dentistry for Children: A Multidisciplinary Team. The conference's multiple sessions were hosted by the Merseyside Branch, the home county of the new BSPD President, Professor Sondos Albadri. The conference was chaired by specialist in paediatric dentistry, Dr Clare Ledingham, and was the first fully virtual BSPD conference, postponed from 2020 because of the pandemic. Its virtual format encouraged engagement and discussion. BSPD's Teachers' Branch also organised their study day to coincide with the conference, with the theme "Current Concepts in Training and Education".

BSPD continues to publish a number of resources and statements to support members. In April, a position statement on limiting advertising of products high in fat, sugar and salt was issued. This was followed in October by an updated position statement on water fluoridation. Indeed, the importance of the message on water fluoridation is significant; and a press release was issued showing BSPD alignment with the Chief Medical Officer's statement in support of water fluoridation.

Again, on the subject of the role that fluoride can play in paediatric health, BSPD then welcomed WHO's inclusion of fluoride preparations on the children's medicine list.

BSPD also marked a new era for molar incisor hypomineralisation (MIH) research and patient management with a new research initiative established

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to improve the dental profession's understanding of MIH and its impact on patients. Led by Greig Taylor, BSPD member and Chairman of CONNECT (a research collaborative for trainees), the initiative will bring together academics to share knowledge as well as gain input from children and young people in optimum management of the condition.

The flagship campaign, DCby1 (Dental Check by One) designed to encourage infant visits to dentists before their first birthday, also continues to be a key focus as the profession navigates its way beyond the Covid-19 pandemic. n 17 February, Professor Raman Bedi, Chair of the Global Child Dental Fund (GCDF), visited Cambodia to attend the signing ceremony of the Phnom Penh Declaration 2022, which highlights the fundamental dental care requirements of patients with special needs. The Cambodian Association of Paediatric Dentistry (CAPD) was a signatory to the Declaration, along with the GCDF, MOH, Cambodian Dental Association, all five dental schools, and several other stakeholders. The CAPD also took part in the launch of a new booklet (in Khmer) on Special Care Dentistry, to which several of our members had contributed.

The Declaration calls for the Cambodian dental schools and other local and international stakeholders to build Special Care Dentistry capacity in the country, ensuring that all children with special care needs can obtain appropriate dental care. There is a focus on more training of dental students and dentists in the area of Special Care Dentistry. The new booklet will be a useful resource to improve their confidence in managing patients with special needs. In addition, a series of free videos have been developed by the GCDF with lecturers in Special Care Dentistry from all over Asia. This will be freely available later this year for dentists and dental students worldwide to improve their capacity in this area.

Access to dental care for children with special needs is presently very limited in Cambodia. There are only three pediatric dentists in the country, and general

anaesthetic services for dental care are generally unavailable. However, a project led by local NGO One-2-One Cambodia, called Healthy Kids Cambodia, is now providing basic dental services in many of the schools for children with special needs. The first level emphasizes daily brushing, hand washing and oral health education. The second level includes GIC fissure sealants and ART restorations. These basic services can be provided at school with minimal equipment and expense. The CAPD is pleased to be partnering with the GCDF and One-2-One Cambodia in support of these initiatives.

Chilean Society of Paediatric Dentistry

r he Sociedad Chilena de Odontopediatría (SCHOP) was not oblivious to the new world reality and continues carrying out activities with its different subsidiaries throughout the country and with our partners through virtual platforms. In the first months of 2020, an online course on Updating in Restorative Dentistry in Pediatric Dentistry was carried out.

The Chilean Society of Pediatric Dentistry during 2021 maintained its scientific activities, updating and supporting its members. Among the most important activities were:

1. In August, at the members' reunion, the election of the new directory for the period 2021-2023 was held. This activity was carried out online with the participation of 70 active members.

2. The international online course "Current Challenges in Pediatric Dentistry Care" was held on 4 December, with the participation of prominent national and international speakers and more than 300 participating dentists.

Chinese Society of Pediatric Dentistry

In 2021 though the epidemic is not over yet, the Chinese Society of Pediatric Dentistry carried out the following academic activities to promote children's oral health in China.

- The CSPD committee continued to hold training courses in the underdeveloped west areas of China to help local pediatric dentists, one was in ZunYi, Guizhou Province, the other was in HuHeHaoTe, Inner Mongolia.
- On March 20, the CSPD organized "World Oral Health Day" activities both online and offline. More than 500 pediatric dentists from 55 hospitals and clinics participated in the activities. The online audience was over 290 thousands, and more than 15 thousands people got offline volunteer consultation and lecture.
- In September, the CSPD organized a series of activities for the "National Love Teeth Day", such as "Love teeth from childhood, pedodontists in action". Eighty-four hospitals and clinics held 97 public benefit activities in 55 cities. Nearly one million people participated.
- 4. The CSPD completed 2 public welfare continuing education projects and carried out 14 popular science activities in various forms in 2021.

• The Theoretical-practical Introductory Course on Aligners in Pediatric Dentistry was also held in person in the city of Bogota on 22-23 October with the participation of 32 people.

• On 4 December, the basic BLS course certified by the AHA was completed in Bogota, with the participation of 12 members of the Academy from different cities in the country.

During this year, we continued to support government and scientific entities to update safe care protocols for the return to our professional activities during the pandemic. When conditions permitted, we returned to our face-to-face activities that allow us to fulfil the mission of the Academy, such as social responsibility work, with the most vulnerable community, bringing them oral health kits and providing them with education in the promotion and prevention of diseases that affect their lives and the quality of life. In different cities of the country, we managed to make a presence, benefiting more than 1,600 children from 2 to 17 years old. Czech Society of Paediatric Dentistry

he Czech Society of Paediatric Dentistry (CSPD) organized its annual scientific meeting "The Paediatric Dentistry Day" in December 2021. This event was hosted by the University Motol in Prague and was very ceremonial. The President of the Czech Dental Chamber Association prof, Roman Smucler, Ph.D. took part and recognized two members of the CSPD board – Prof Martina Kukletova, Ph.D. and dr, Kristina Ginzelova – for their long-term medical, pedagogical and scientific work in the field of paediatric dentistry. The opening ceremony was followed by a scientific program in which the lecturers addressed the topics of caries prevention in children, impaction of teeth, early childhood caries, ankyloglossia and case reports. Last year the CSPD published "Recommended guidelines in the prevention of dental caries in children and adolescents." These guidelines were developed on the basis of evidence-based medicine and focused

on caries risk assessment, oral hygiene, fluoride prevention, nutrition in relation to dental caries and regular recalls. The guidelines also include chapters on fissure sealing, erosion of hard dental tissues and preventive counselling. The guidelines include the IAPD Bangkok Declaration and four key preventive priorities: raising awareness of early childhood caries, limiting sugar intake, performing twice daily toothbrushing and providing first preventive guidance. Last year, the CSPD continued its cooperation with the Alliance for Cavityfree Future. A member of the CSPD Association Board, Prof Koberova, MD, Ph.D, is an active representative of the Czech Republic in the Alliance. The CSPD is currently facing a major challenge. Next year the CSPD will organize and host the EAPD Interim Seminar and Guidelines Workshop. All members of CSPD are looking forward to this event and cordially invite the paediatric dentists and students of dentistry to the 23rd EAPD Interim Seminar and Guidelines Workshop in Prague in May 2023.

The biennial Congress of the IAPD was set to take place in 2021; but because of the pandemic, it has been postponed to 2023. The 29th IAPD Congress will take place in Maastricht, the Netherlands, from 14-17 June 2023. The theme will be "Joining Forces in Paediatric Dentistry". We are really looking forward to seeing you all in Maastricht, the Netherlands in 2023!

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
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

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German Society of Paediatric Dentistry

he German Society of Paediatric Dentistry (Deutsche Gesellschaft für Kinderzahnheilkunde, DGKiZ) was again strongly affected in 2021 by the second year of the COVID-19 pandemic. The annual meeting had to be converted into a purely virtual congress, but nevertheless enjoyed a high level of attendance. After 2020, it became obvious again that the online format, which contained all the components of a face-to-face congress, has a particular appeal for a number of colleagues. Our industry partners have also become accustomed to this new reality and support us as before. However, the bottom line is that the vast majority of DGKiZ members want to be able to attend a congress in person again. The conditions of the pandemic have also brought forth quite supportive impulses and positive aspects for our Society. For example, we started to offer webinars on a regular basis in 2021. Many DGKiZ members very much appreciate this form of short, monthly continuing education, with great approval also expressed by new members joining DGKiZ. In the meantime, we have grown to a society with more than 1,900 members, most of whom work in private practices. DGKiZ directs its affairs from its office in Würzburg where we can also hold face-to-face

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training events on a small scale. Particular mention should be made of our training courses in paediatric dentistry for dental nurses. This continuing education program for our assistant staff is specially geared to the needs of paediatric dental practices. In 2021, the DGKiZ, together with associations of pediatricians, adopted joint recommendations on caries prevention with fluoride in young children. This agreement put an end to a two-decade dispute over the appropriate way to administer fluoride to young children. The agreement stipulates that fluoride-containing children's toothpastes should be used from the age of 12 months at the latest, optionally from the eruption of the first primary tooth. In 2021, a large part of our workload was tied up with finding a new publisher for our journal " Oralprophylaxe & Kinderzahnheilkunde" (Oral Prophylaxis & Pediatric Dentistry). We now are pleased to have found a renowned and strong partner for our journal, which is above all a scientific journal, in the publisher Springer-Nature. International submissions for publication from all fields of oral prevention in children and paediatric dentistry are always welcome. We wish everyone the very best. Stay well and be safe.

Indian Society of Pedodontics & Preventive Dentistry

SPPD organized the following events in 2021: 42nd Annual Conference "PEDODISHA-21; Curriculum Meet the Culture" was organized in November. The main highlights of the four-day conference included 6 foreign speakers, including Dr Marcelo Bönecker and Dr Jeffrey Dean, 12 preconference courses. along with 946 oral and 428 poster presentations. 1,965 delegates attended. Dr Susant Mohanty was the Organizing Chairman.

A reviewer's training program on "Effective Peer Review" under the chairmanship of Dr Radhika Muppa was organized in October. The aim of the workshop was to improve the peer review process for the society's PubMed indexed Journal (JISPPD). ISPPD "Faculty Development Programme; Training the Teachers" was organized on virtual mode under the chairmanship of Dr Shabnam Zahir. More than 250 faculty members working in different dental colleges attended. Three public awareness competitions – Oral Health Day, Children's Day and Teacher's Day – were organized with the aim to increase dental health awareness amongst children, their parents and primary school teachers. 101 dental colleges and approximately 40,000 primary school children participated.

"PedoVirCon-2021; Enhancing Skills through Demonstration" was organized in January, inaugurated by Dr Marcelo Bonceker, IAPD President. Speakers enlightened the delegates through video demonstrations on 25 different topics. Dr Shantanu Choudhari was the chief coordinator. A "Virtual Pedo RaRe-2; A Rapid Revision Summit" was held in April 2021 for postgraduate students to rapidly revise the syllabus before the university examination. The summit included 24 lectures. The chief coordinator of this program was Dr Sharath Asokan. A national-level Essay Competition was also organized for Indian pediatric dentists on the following topics - "Caries Excavation; Current Concepts and Techniques" and "3D Printing; Its Applications in Pediatric Dentistry". 103 entries were received; and Dr Shraddha Saika from ITS Dental College won 1st prize.

O21 marked a very special year for the Irish Society of Dentistry for Children (ISDC) as we celebrated our 50th anniversary.



he Association had a fruitful year despite the challenges of COVID 19 infection that emerged as a global pandemic; the first case in the country being reported on 12th March. The Government imposed travel restrictions, and during that time KAPD launched online continuing professional development webinars with large audiences of up to 500 participants. Some of the thematic areas covered were: tips on how to continue practicing dentistry in the midst of the then emerging pandemic, special care dentistry, pharmacologic behaviour management and operating a dental practice as a business, among others. In attendance, were participants and presenters drawn from Kenya and several other countries including Tanzania, Zimbabwe, Uganda, Egypt, India, Nigeria, United Arab Emirates and Pakistan to mention a few.

Soldiering through 2021, Kenya was significantly more affected by the Covid-19 pandemic in 2021 than in 2020. Following the Association's AGM in November 2020, newly elected officials took up their roles at the start of 2021. Although a number of the activities continued to be virtual, they were slightly different from those done in previous years. KAPD held educational webinars that tackled new topics including: Pricing Strategies, Myobrace Technology, Early Childhood Caries in Low & Middle Income Countries, Children and Emotions, and The Airway and the Dentist.

KAPD joined the Kenya Dental Association in commemorating World Oral Health Day on 20 March 2021. In addition, KAPD held hands with the Uganda Dental Association in a webinar on Myofunctional Orthodontics.

Reaching Out and Outreach

We participated in the 28th Congress of the IAPD Virtual held in June 2021. Two abstracts on Dental Phobia and Oral Health Seeking Practices among Dental Students were presented, thus contributing towards the global oral health information basket. 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






We look forward to hosting physical meetings and conferences in the near future; but until that is possible, we shall continue our activities virtually.




PSSA Conference - hands-on and virtual hands-on 15 October



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The Swiss Association for Paediatric Dentistry (SVK-ASP) is a professional society of the Swiss Dental Association (SSO) with nearly 450 registered members. Its purpose is to promote paediatric dentistry in Switzerland by bringing together all dentists with special interest in paediatric dentistry.

SVK also promotes the exchange of experience among professional colleagues and maintains close cooperation with paediatric dentistry departments of the university dental centres and with the school dental clinics.

SVK facilitates professional development through lectures, courses, and publications; this includes the well-attended annual conference held in mid-January with challenging presentations and nearly 400 participants. 2021 in the continuity of 2020 also suffered from health restrictions due to Covid-19 and unfortunately our SVK/ASP annual congress did not take place in Bern as usual but was held virtually.

Regarding continuing professional education, a big challenge has been continuing after 2020 by all dental associations during 2021. Again, a vast number of online seminars and meetings as well as conferences have been made available to continue with professional education. All paediatric dentistry associations took the call for continuing professional education and to give lectures online. Like every year, the first part of the Proficiency certificate SVK nitrous oxide sedation, the «Introductory course and basics of nitrous oxide sedation» took place in a central location near the train station in Zurich Oerlikon.

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This course with theory and practical exercises on nitrous oxide sedation offers seven hours of practical training time in addition to a varied program. As SVK events, we had on the 6 September 2021 the first group participating to the Curriculum in pediatric dentistry of the SVK. This curriculum is designed with practical relevance in mind, and it is important that the knowledge can also be implemented in practice. The language of instruction is German or English. The handouts are handed out in German and/or French. Recognized and committed speakers from the fields of pediatric dentistry, orthodontics and periodontology will discuss the various topics.

The "Focus on Pediatric Dentistry" consists of 3 modules and can be completed with the title "WBA SSO in Pediatric Dentistry". In 2021 we were happy to announce that we had an SVK AWARD winner. We congratulate Mrs. med. dent. Alina Paganini warmly to the presentation of the SVK/ASP AWARD in honor of Prof Rudolf Hotz. Her work "Margin Integrity of Bulk-Fill Composite Restorations in Primary Teeth" convinced the jury.

Finally, at the beginning of November 2021, the SVK board met for a 1.5-day retreat. A dynamic discussion arose on the 5 main topics of further education, young talent, membership structure, communication, and organization of the SVK. Despite feeling a bit like 2021 at the beginning of this new year, we all hope that by 2022 the health restrictions will ease, that bars and restaurants will reopen, that people will be able to gather again, that life will get back on track...



• Applicants are not eligible for another prize at the Meeting.




